DAVID BECOMES KING

2 SAMUEL 2:4 NIV

Then the men of Judah came to Hebron, and there they anointed David king over the tribe of **Judah**.

2 SAMUEL 5:3-4 NIV

When all the elders of **Israel** had come to King David at Hebron, the king made a covenant with them at Hebron before the LORD, and they anointed David king over Israel.⁴ David was thirty years old when he became king, and he reigned forty years.

2 SAMUEL 7:1-3 NIV

After the king was settled in his palace and the LORD had given him rest from all his enemies around him,² he said to Nathan the prophet, “Here I am, living in a house of cedar, while the ark of God remains in a tent.”³ Nathan replied to the king, “Whatever you have in mind, go ahead and do it, for the LORD is with you.”



2 SAMUEL 7:4-7 NIV

But that night the word of the LORD came to Nathan, saying: ⁵ “Go and tell my servant David, ‘This is what the LORD says: Are you the one to build me a house to dwell in? ⁶ I have not dwelt in a house from the day I brought the Israelites up out of Egypt to this day. I have been moving from place to place with a tent as my dwelling. ⁷ Wherever I have moved with all the Israelites, did I ever say to any of their rulers whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, Why have you not built me a house of cedar?’”



THE LORD'S PURPOSE FOR DAVID

2 SAMUEL 7:8-11a NIV

“Now then, tell my servant David, ‘This is what the LORD Almighty says: I took you from the pasture, from tending the flock, and appointed you ruler over my people Israel. ⁹ “I have been with you wherever you have gone, and I have cut off all your enemies from before you. Now I will make your name great, like the names of the greatest men on earth. ¹⁰ And I will provide a place for my people Israel and will plant them so that they can have a home of their own and no longer be disturbed. Wicked people will not oppress them anymore, as they did at the beginning ¹¹ and have done ever since the time I appointed leaders over my people Israel. I will also give you rest from all your enemies.’”

ABRAHAMIC COVENANT GENESIS 12:1-3 NIV



THE LORD'S PURPOSE BEYOND DAVID

2 SAMUEL 7:11b-16 NIV

“The LORD declares to you that the LORD himself will establish a house for you: ¹² When your days are over and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring to succeed you, your own flesh and blood, and I will establish his kingdom. ¹³ He is the one who will build a house for my Name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. ¹⁴ I will be his father, and he will be my son. When he does wrong, I will punish him with a rod wielded by men, with foggings inflicted by human hands. ¹⁵ But my love will never be taken away from him, as I took it away from Saul, whom I removed from before you. ¹⁶ Your house and your kingdom will endure forever before me; your throne will be established forever.”

MATTHEW 21:7-9 NIV

They brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on. ⁸ A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹ The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted, “Hosanna to the Son of David!” “Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!” “Hosanna in the highest heaven!”
