The Ascension

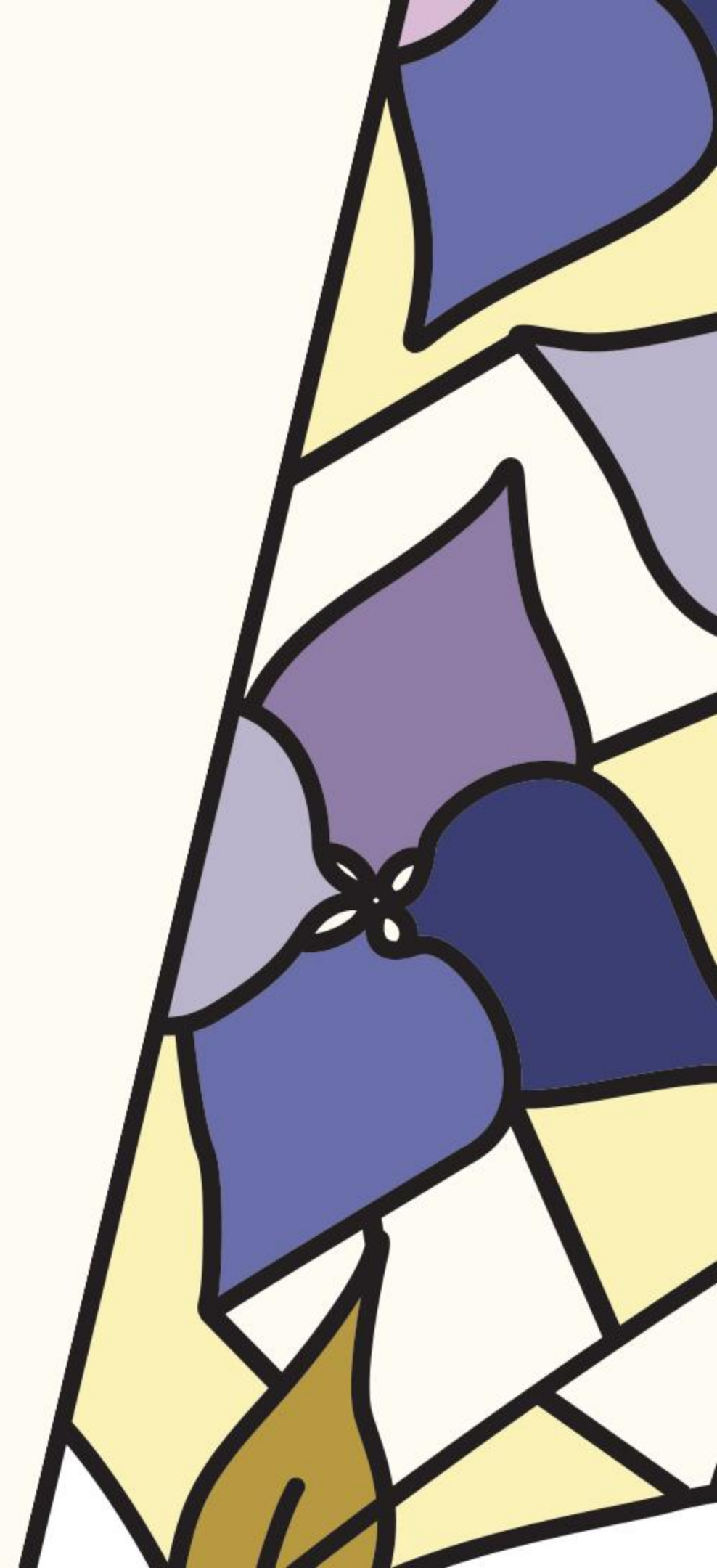

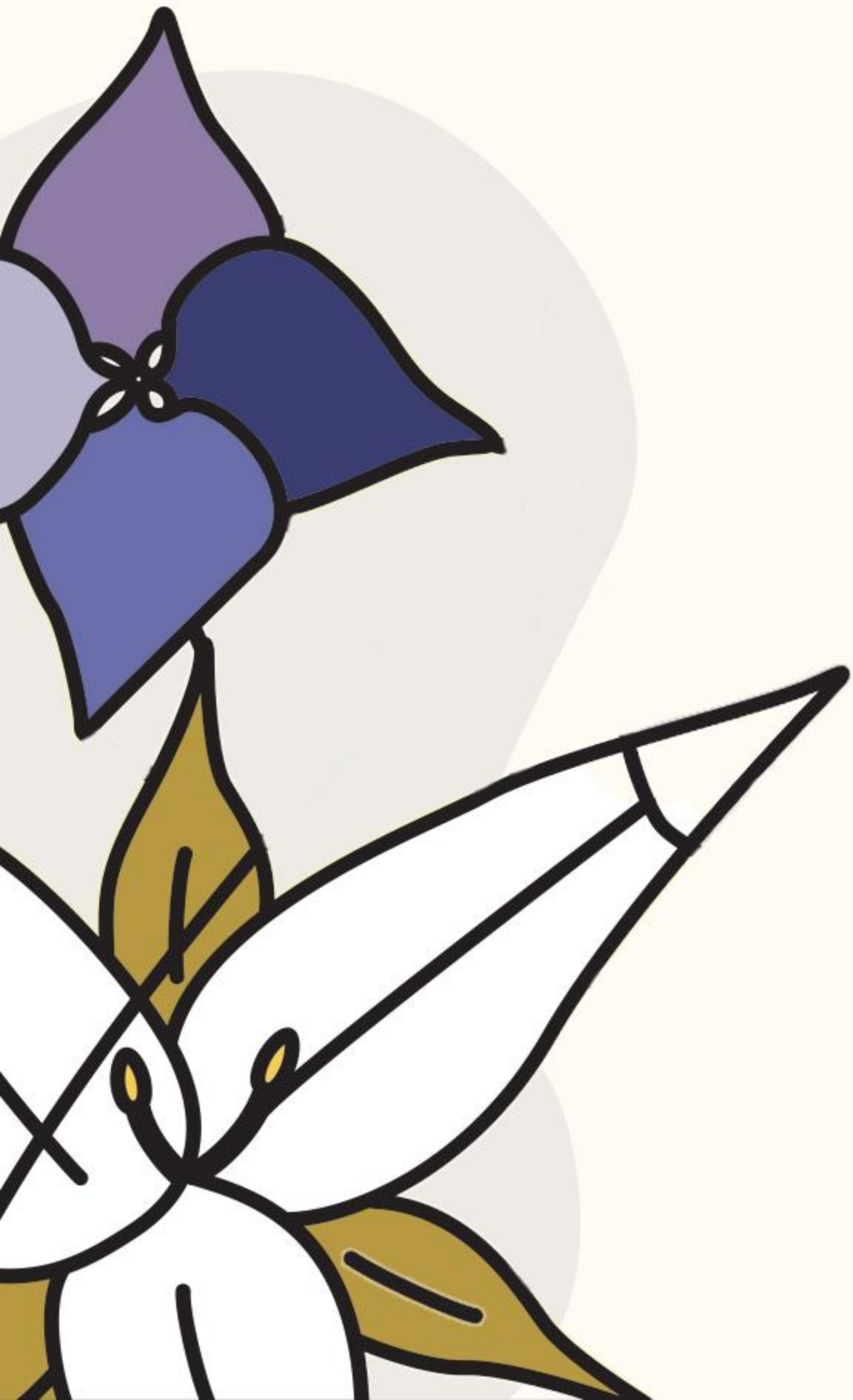

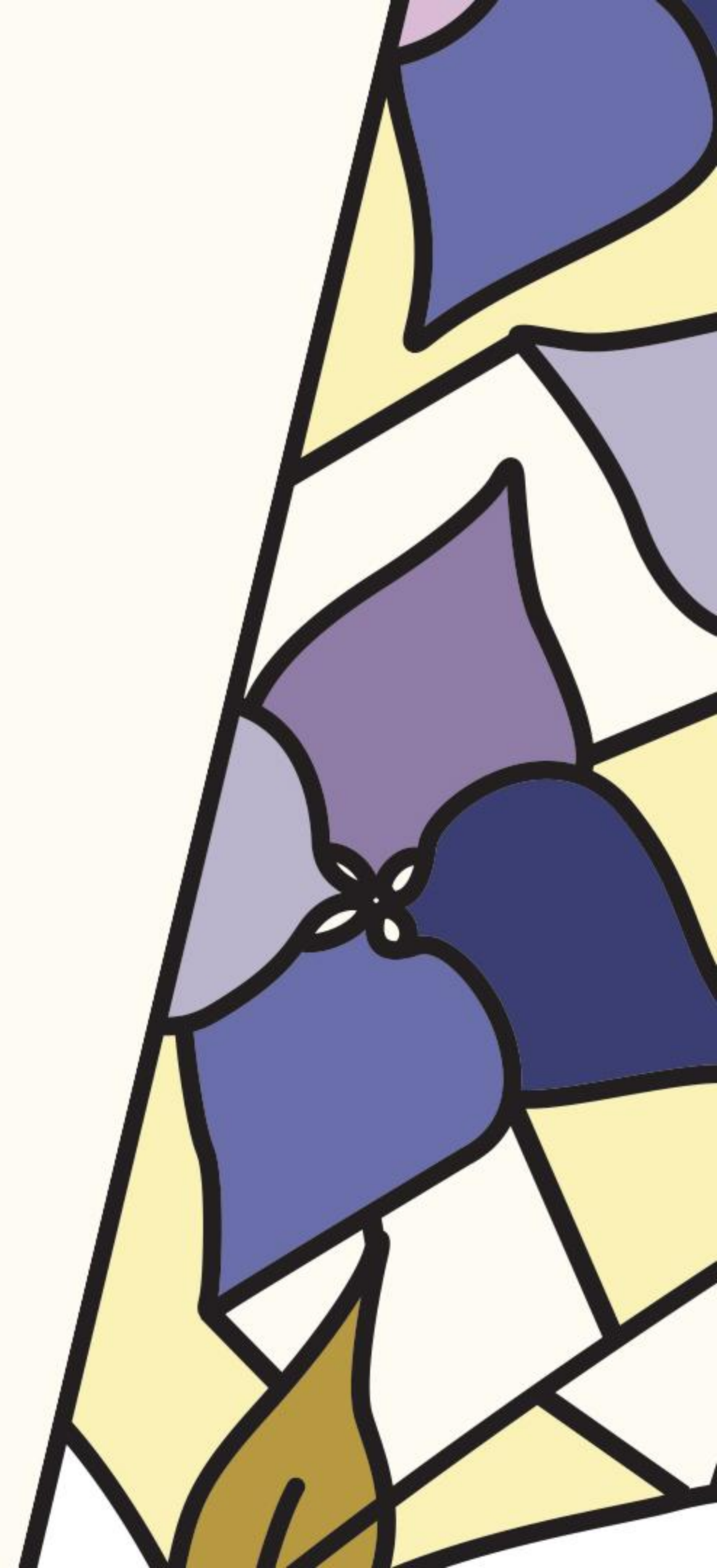

ROMANS 8:31-39

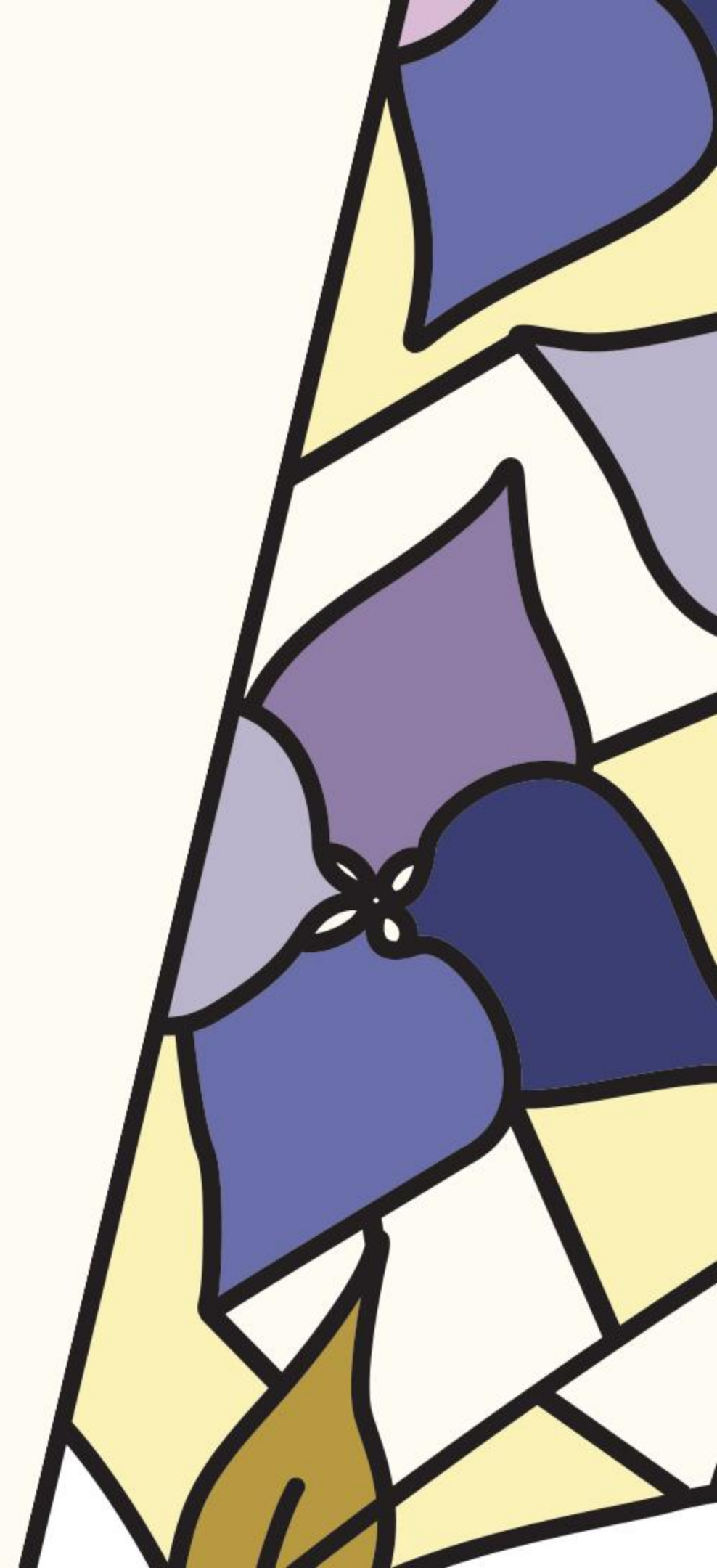
What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?

Romans 8:31-32 NIV



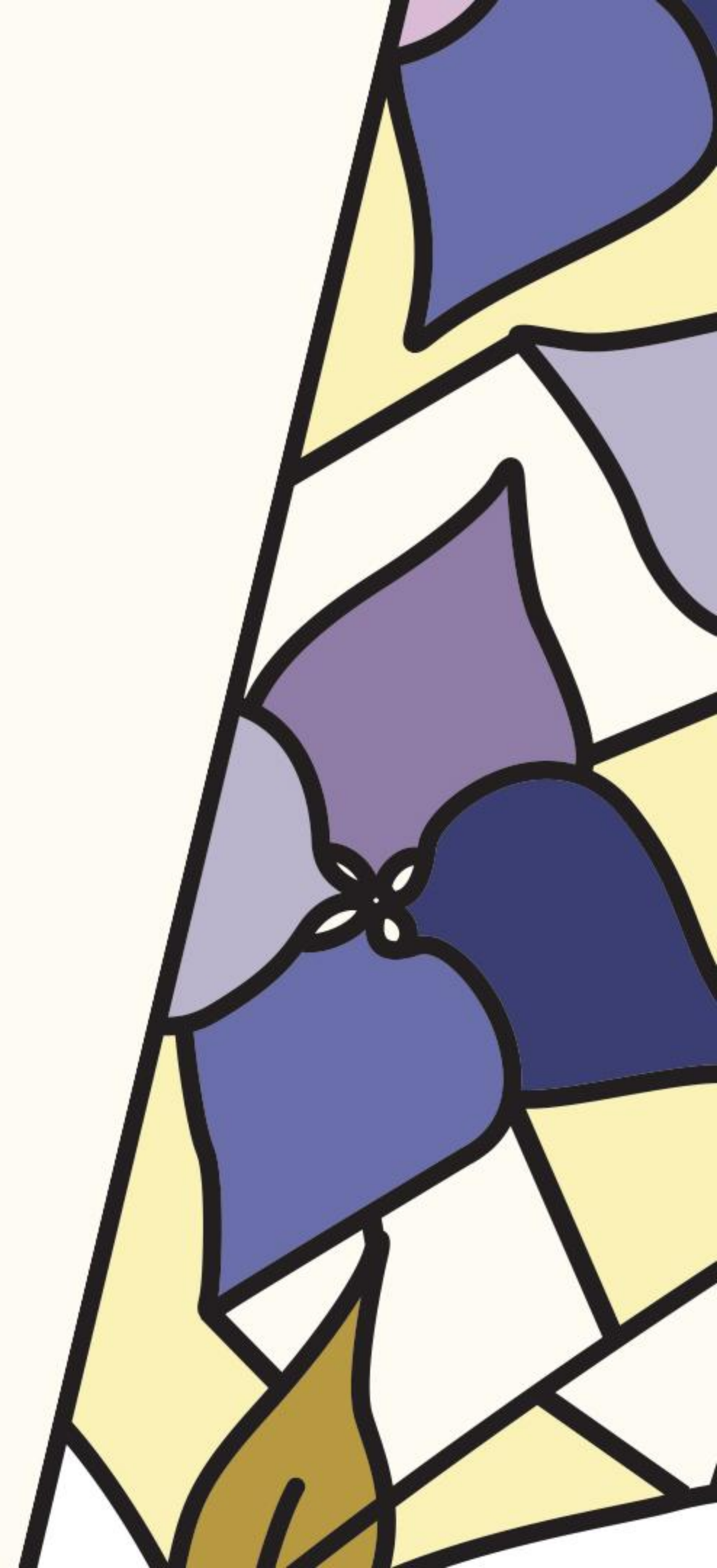

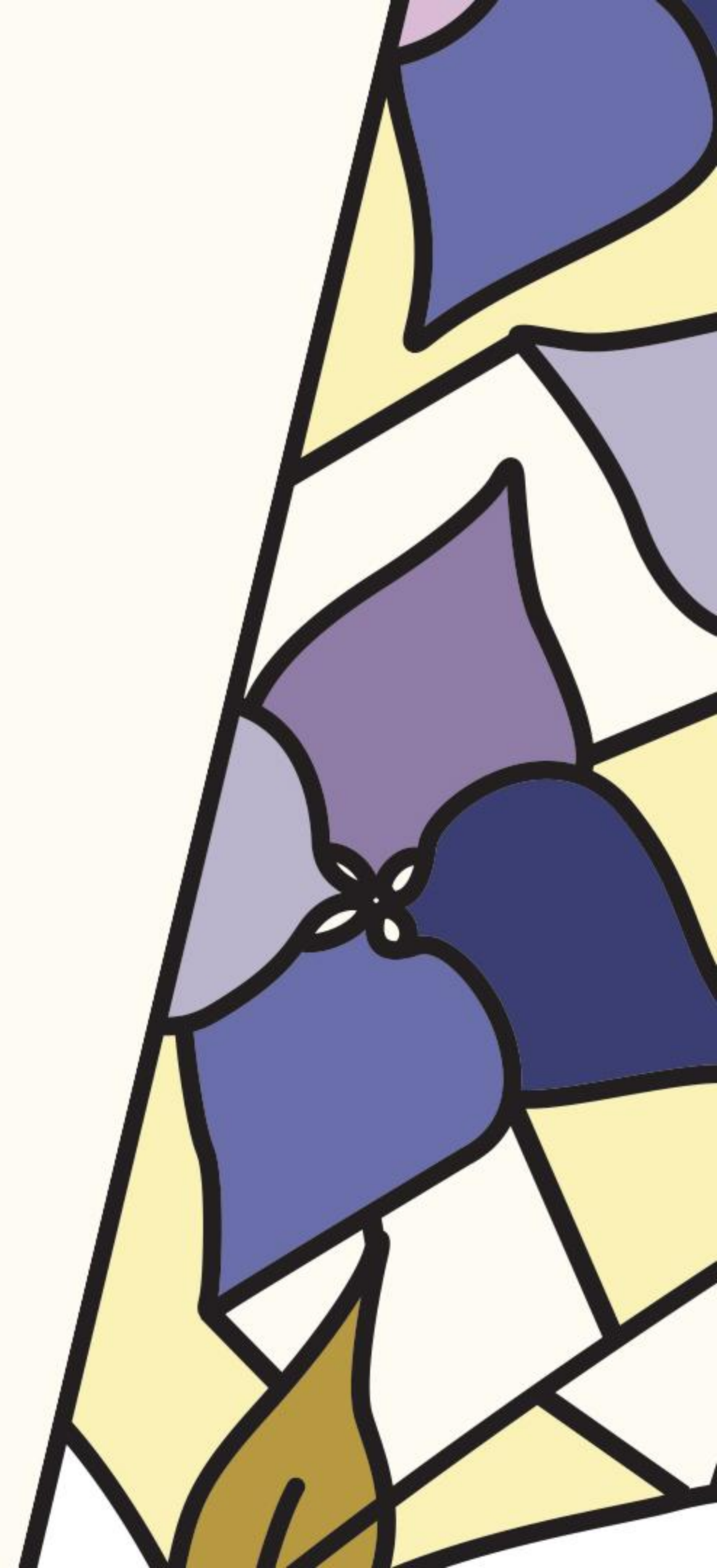
Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?

we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.”

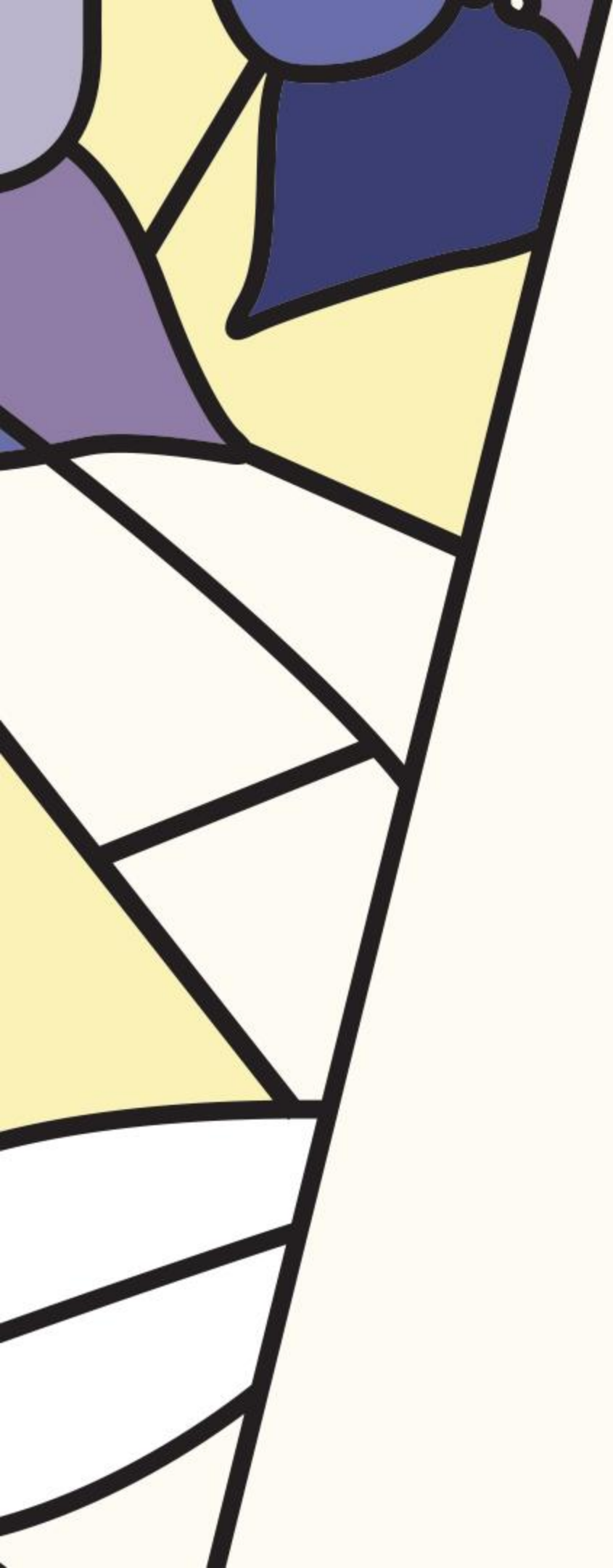

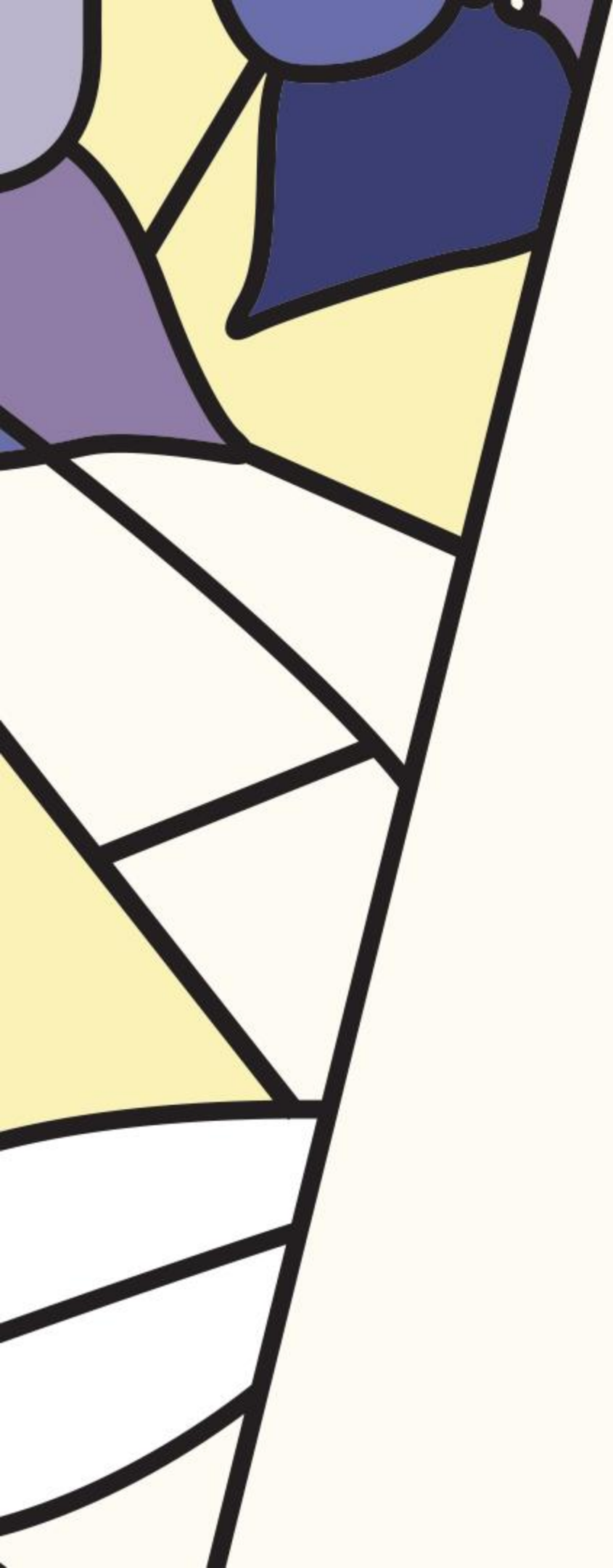
