Can you describe a time in your life when you knew that something was about to happen and that things could turn out very badly?

GROW

Read Matthew 16:21, Matthew 17:22-23, Matthew 20:17-19, and John 13:18-20.

Jesus predicted His death multiple times with His disciples. In verses 19-21, He gives us the reason for the predictions of His own death. How do you think you might have felt or reacted about hearing this if you had been among the followers in the upper room?

Read John 13:21-30.

This scene happens immediately after Jesus washed the feet of the disciples. What does this tell us about Jesus, who was willing to wash the feet of the one who was about to betray Him?

Jesus predicted what was to happen, then stayed with His men and even answered their questions. What things can you think of that He did *not* do under the pressure of this situation (which other leaders might have done)?

As you look closely at verses 22-26, what do the disciples appear to be focused on? Did it seem that they had any idea as to what Judas was about to do?

Seeing the way that Jesus handled the betrayal from Judas in this passage, how can it help us respond to challenging people or situations in our lives when we feel betrayed in lesser ways?

Verse 21 says that Jesus "was troubled in spirit" because He knew what was about to take place. Read verses 19-29. What do you find interesting about the way that Jesus responded in this situation? How did He lead His followers during the intense circumstances which led to His trial and death?

What aspect of this passage about Jesus is most impactful to you? How does this deepen your love and appreciation for all that Christ has done for you?
